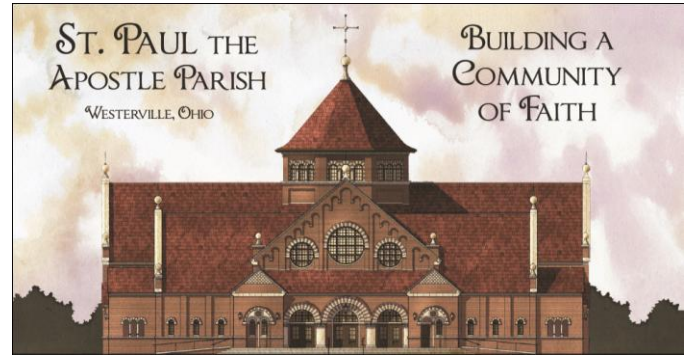

Presence



We believe in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Christ is present to us in many ways: in his Word, in the church's prayer, in the poor, the sick, the imprisoned, in the sacraments, in the sacrifice of the Mass, and in the person of the minister. He is present most especially in consecrated bread and wine. In the most Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist, Christ is wholly, truly, and substantially present. This has always been the conviction of the church from the very beginning. By the consecration of bread and wine a change takes place so that we can affirm that Christ is really present. We express our faith in the real presence of Christ under the form of bread and wine through signs of respect such as genuflection or bowing. Often in speaking about the Eucharist, we use the words "bread" and "wine" in song, in prayer, or in explanations, but we should never forget that what we are referring to is the Body and Blood of Christ. To receive communion then, is to receive Christ himself who offers himself as our spiritual food and who remains with us in the tabernacle as one who is with us always and ready to nourish those who are ill or dying.
